

Level 2 Review opens Richardson office

Level 2 Review, an East Texas business whose services include the legal review of documents during pretrial exchanges of information, has opened a Richardson location.

In a news release, the Tyler company said the new 4,500-square-foot digs have the “technology infrastructure to deploy more than 80 attorneys.”

In an interview Thursday, **Level 2**'s president and CEO, **Joey Seeber**, said the company will be using the Richardson office on a project basis for now. “We have about 55 people there right now,” he said, adding that the shop was opened in about a week in response to a client’s need.

“Right now, they are working on one large project,” Seeber said of the Richardson office. “But we consistently have projects requiring that many people, which was the reason for moving ahead with that space.”

Incorporated last year, **Level 2** currently has nearly 100 employees, Seeber said.

Among the leaders of the Richardson operation are Roberta Ozan, who is vice president of client services, and Daniel Bonner, a senior project manager, according to the news release.

Among other things, **Level 2** uses lawyers to see whether documents should be released during “discovery,” which is a pretrial phase of court cases during which litigants exchange information and other evidence.
